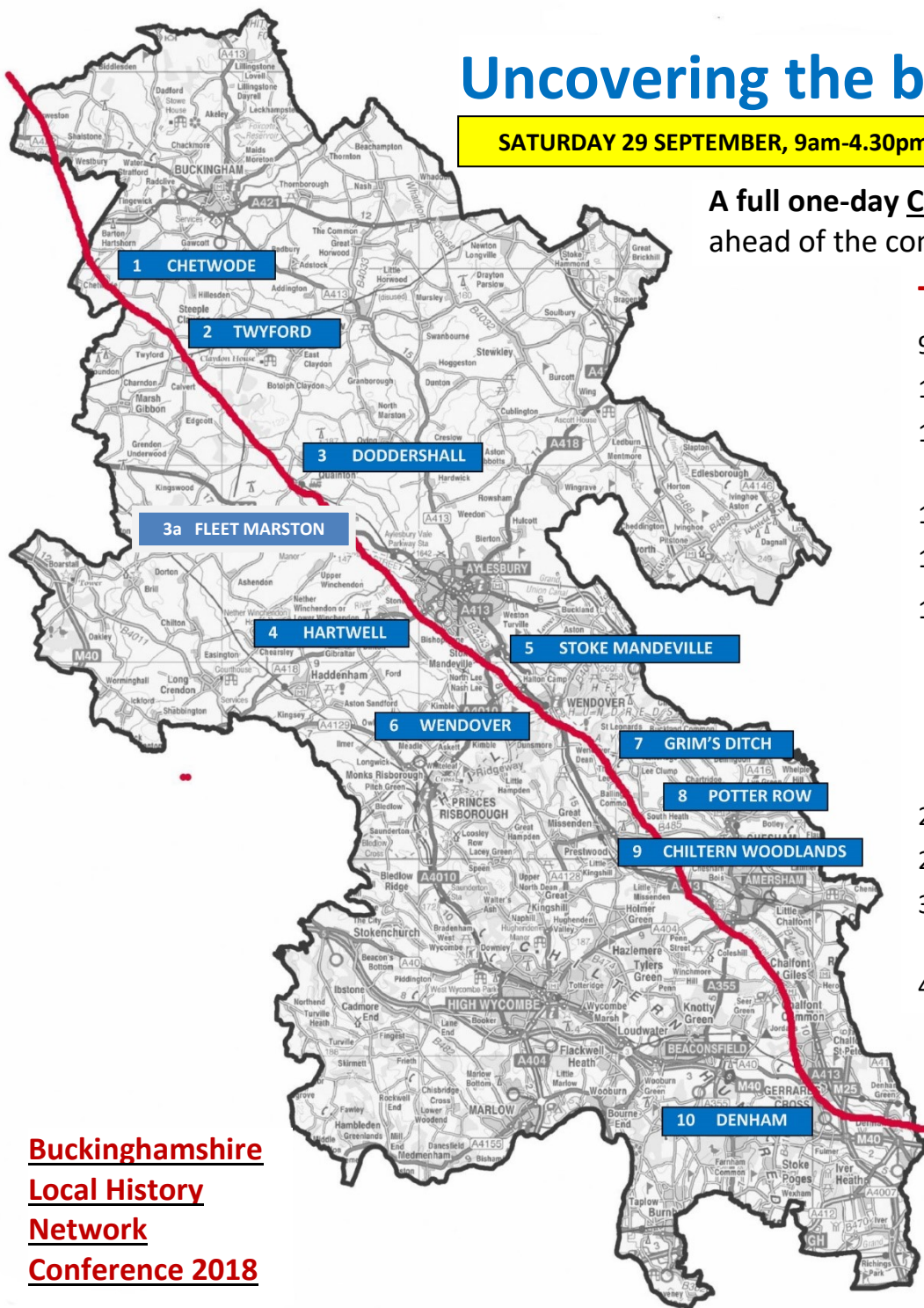

- A Roman town at Fleet Marston,
- A medieval church and churchyard at Stoke Mandeville,
- A deserted village at Doddershall where sheep evicted people,
- The Iron-Age earthworks of Grim's Ditch in the Chilterns.

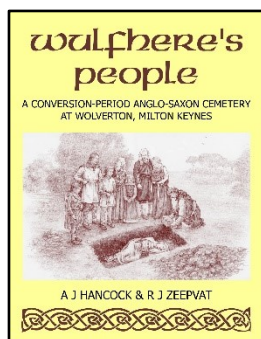

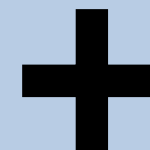
