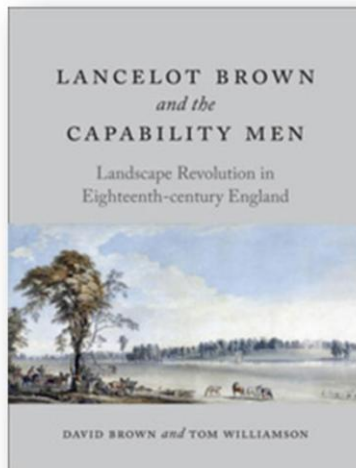


Bucks Gardens Trust's Events - 2016/2017
