# The Society

*The Society (known as BAS, for short) was founded in 1847 and is one of the oldest in the country. It is the senior body in the County in the fields of Archaeology, Architecture and Local History. It has active specialist sections for Historic Buildings and Natural History. The BAS covers the whole of the old historic county of Buckinghamshire from Milton Keynes in the north to Eton in the south.*

*The Society organises a range of activities every year - a Winter lecture programme, outings, the Buckinghamshire Local History Network Conference, and the Society's Active Archaeology Group*

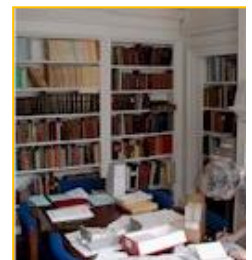


*The Society founded the County Museum and still owns the main museum buildings and a large part of its collections, although the museum is now leased and run by the County Council.*
