The Society (known as BAS, for short) was founded in 1847. It is the senior body in the County in the fields of Archaeology, Architecture and Local History. BAS organises a range of activities every year - a Winter Lecture Programme, outings, the Buckinghamshire Local History Network Conference, and the Society's Active Archaeology Group. The society publishes *Records of Buckinghamshire* and other publications that focus on various aspects of the history and archaeology of the county.



The Society founded the County Museum and still owns the main museum buildings and a large part of its collections, although the museum is now leased and run by the County Council.
