DISCOVERY OF EARLY POTTERY AT
TYRINGHAM

Whilst some excavations were being made in November, 1927, 100 yards from Tyringham House and 300 yards from the river, a large cinerary urn, much broken, and a small food vessel in perfect condition were found about two feet below the surface of the ground. The broken urn is being pieced together, and is dated by the British Museum as c. 1000 B.C.
