EDITORIAL NOTE

Changes in the format of RECORDS OF BUCKINGHAMSHIRE have not been frequent since it was first published in 1854, but the overall size was altered both in 1934 and 1947. This number, which starts Volume XX and covers the year 1975, marks another change to a wider page and length of line; of greater significance has been the decision to alter the printing method from letterpress to offset-litho which, in present conditions, is more economical and gives greater flexibility in the reproduction of plates. These changes have been partially responsible for the late appearance of this number; some typographical details do not yet conform to the normal practice of a learned journal but it is hoped to make improvements in future numbers.
