

ANTIQUITIES FOUND NEAR THORNBOROUGH.

The Hon. Richard Neville has in his collection some bronze vases, of exquisite form, some cinerary urns of glass, a bronze lamp, and some other remarkable remains, which were discovered near Thornborough, Bucks, in a tumulus which proved to be the depository of the richest series of Romano-British remains hitherto explored, with the exception, perhaps, alone of the Bartlow Hills, in Cambridgeshire, excavated by the late Mr. Rokewode.—
