

MEMORIAL WINDOW TO Mr. COLLISON,
NEWPORT PAGNELL.

A richly-stained glass window has just been placed at the east end of the south aisle of the parish Church by the Rev. G. Morley, vicar, to the memory of the late R. Collison, Esq., surgeon, of this place. The design of the window, which is very beautiful, was by Mr. G. E. Street, the Diocesan Architect, the stone-work was executed by Mr. John Greenway, of Leighton Buzzard, and the glass was supplied by Mr. A. Gibbs, 38, Bedford-square, London. The subjects of the four compartments are:—Moses lifting up the brazen serpent; Christ healing the lame man at the pool of Bethesda; Christ giving sight to the blind; and an illustration of the parable of the good Samaritan. Beneath the window is a brass plate with the following inscription:—"This window was erected to the memory of Robert Collison, surgeon, a liberal benefactor to this parish, who died April 3, 1860, aged 78 years, by his grateful friend, George Morley, vicar."
