THE ACCOUNT OF SUBSCRIPTIONS TO THE PRESENT TO KING CHARLES II., FROM THE HUNDRED OF BURNHAM.

THE original account of the subscriptions to the present to King Charles II., on his restoration, is in the possession of our member, Mr. George Weller, of The Plantation, Amersham, through whose kindness a copy of it is here given. Commissioners were appointed to obtain these subscriptions in pursuance of the Statute 13, Carl. II. cap. 4. The special interest in this account arises from the names of those who took part in this particular display of loyalty, some of whom it will be clearly seen were the ancestors of those who are still freeholders in the neighbourhood of Amersham. The first of the Commissioners will be found to be Sir Thomas Hampson, Bart.; he was one of the family of the Hampsons, who were the owners of the Taplow Estate. The Mansion was pulled down and rebuilt after the estate was acquired by the Earls of Orkney, and is now known as Taplow Sir Thomas Hampson died in 1670, and was Court. buried at Taplow. The next Commissioner named in the account is Sir Heneage Proby, Knt., of Raans, in Amersham; he was High Sheriff for Bucks in 1636. Raans is one of the Manors in Amersham which came into the hands of the Proby family, Sir Henry Proby being the first possessor, who died in 1662, and whose monument, with others of his family, was formerly in the Church of Amersham, but has now disappeared.* One other Commissioner is William Penn, who was the Admiral-afterwards knighted-and the father of Governor Penn, of Pennsylvania. It will be noticed that the letter A is appended to his signature. Penn's signature alone, it will be felt, gives interest to this document.

The collection at Chesham is headed by the names of the Commissioners for that district. Sir William Bowyer, of Denham Court, was one; he was High Sheriff in 1661, and it would appear that he was appointed a Commissioner in consequence of his holding that office at the time of the collection. He lived to an advanced age, and died 1722, and was buried at Denham. In the church is a monument recording his worth and his munificence to that parish. Charles Cheney [or Cheyne], another of these Commissioners, was member for Amersham in 1653.

Among the subscribers we have only to notice the names of Grove, Shrimpton, Bovingdon, to recall them as familiar to us at the present time—one or another of which still represents important interests in the Hundred of Burnham.—ED.
